A Few Thoughts in Looking Toward Mother's Day...

I Samuel 1:25-28, ²⁵ *When they had slaughtered the bull, they brought the boy to Eli, ²⁶ and she said to him, "As surely as you live, my lord, I am the woman who stood here beside you praying to the Lord. ²⁷ I prayed for this child, and the Lord has granted me what I asked of him. ²⁸ So now I give him to the Lord. For his whole life he will be given over to the Lord." And he worshiped the Lord there.*

Hannah was childless. More than anything she wanted a child and wanted a son in particular. When the time came to go to the temple and bring offerings to God, she was upset over not being able to have a child and wept bitterly, praying for God to allow her to get pregnant and bear a son. She encountered Eli the priest at that time of sorrow and told him her story. She made a vow to God that if the Lord gave her a child, she would dedicate him to God and give him over to be used in the Lord's service.

God answered Hannah's prayers and gave her a son, Samuel. After he was weaned, Hannah took him to the temple and gave him to Eli the priest to be raised there and to spend his life serving God in the temple.

Hannah was a good Mom because she prayed for her children. She prayed for Samuel before he was born and no doubt prayed for him as he joined in the Lord's work. Mom, you can pray for your children no matter where you are in the parenting journey. Even after your kids are grown and out on their own, they still need our prayers. God will be ever present in their lives when you cannot be there for them every second of their life. Never stop praying for your children.

Hannah was a good Mom because she dedicated her child to God. She realized that her son didn't really belong to her. He was a gift from God placed in her care for a short time to nurture and then to be set free to

live a life of service to God. Hannah supported her child in the Lord's work. As Christian Moms instead of asking, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" you should probably ask, "How do you think God wants to use you?" Hannah was concerned that her child find his place in God's service. Moms, you should be guiding your children to think about where they fit into God's plan, and that includes helping them as they entertain thoughts of planning their vocation and future.

Hannah set a good example for her children in practicing her faith. As mentioned before, Hannah was a woman of prayer, so no doubt her son Samuel had seen and heard her pray, but she also set the example by going to the temple to worship. Many parents think that if I just take my kids and drop them off at the church that will be good enough for them to learn about God. Parents need to set the example of showing how important it is to worship and grow in faith by not just using the church as a baby sitting service, but to seek a deeper and vital relationship with God themselves. Mom, you set patterns for your kids to follow in.

Thank God for mothers! Moms, be the best you can be! Pray for your kids. Dedicate them to the Lord and encourage them to find their place in God's service. Most of all be an example for your kids to follow. You plant seeds in your children's lives every day. Some of those seeds are blooming and growing now. Some may not even take root until after you have passed on, but know that your work is not in vain! May God bless all our mothers!

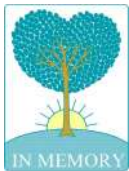

Preschool Choir Notes

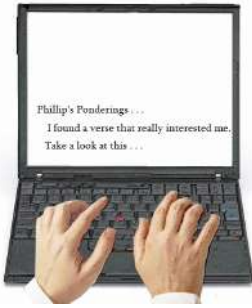

Phillip's Ponderings

When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick . . . So they set out and went from village to village, preaching the gospel and healing

people everywhere

(Luke 9:1-2 & 6).

The ministry of Jesus Christ is one of sending. The incarnation of Jesus Christ as one sent into the world sets the tone for the sending ministry that followed. Even before the crucifixion, we see Jesus sending the twelve out to proclaim the good news. Later, after the resurrection of Christ, Jesus gives the church the instructions to go out into all the world.

Just as God sent his son, Jesus sends his church. If a church is to continue the ministry of Christ, then we too must be agents of sending. We focus so much energy on bringing people *into* the church. What about our mission to send people *out* from the church? Through support of missions, we do participate in a sending ministry. Through both education and contribution to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, we support a mission sending organization that reaches many remote places in the world that we could never practically go. Although, maybe we could do more. How long has it been since a group of adults from Hunton were sent to another country for the purpose of God's mission?

Not all of us are in the position to participate in long-distance mission opportunities, but we can all participate in the ministry of sending. Each Sunday when you leave the sanctuary, you enter God's mission field. Wherever you find yourselves, recognize that you were sent there by God to be a representative of the Kingdom. Our greatest mission field and greatest opportunity for influence may be among our family and friends.

Finally, I come to a bit of sad news; but even in this, I hope that you will rejoice with me over this opportunity of sending. At the business meeting in April, I announced that I am resigning from Hunton after six years to accept a position as pastor in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. My experiences at Hunton have prepared me for this next journey. Consider my new ministry as an extension of Hunton and a part of the church's responsibility to send out qualified people to proclaim the Gospel to new ears.

Thank you for all the love and support that you have shown me and my family over the years. I will miss all of you greatly. May the Lord continue to bless your church.

Children's Corner

Most of you have heard by now that I have resigned from my position at Hunton to accept an opportunity to serve as a pastor in Rocky Mount, North Carolina. It saddens me to say goodbye. I will miss the children most of all. I will continue to pray for the children's department at Hunton Baptist Church.

For the last few years, I have taught the children about Cooperative Baptist Fellowship missionaries—servants of God who are sent around the world to meet needs for God's Kingdom. It should come as no surprise, then, that God would send me from the church to reach others as well. Help your children to see that I am trying to serve God and fulfill God's call in my life in the same way that the missionaries that they learn about have responded to God's direction.

Parents, I have an even greater challenge for you. I don't have any special gifts for children's ministry. Rather, I accepted the call a few years ago to give the children at Hunton priority in my ministry, to love them, and to give them a voice within the church. You all have those same gifts and abilities. I challenge all of our parents to get even more involved and use your gifts to continue to strengthen the children's programs.

I have seen many of you already doing this. More than ever before, parents are stepping up to help. From preparing meals, chaperoning events, decorating, teaching, assisting with crafts...in so many ways, you are joining the cause and making a difference in the lives of our kids. So I feel confident that this good work will continue, and I ask that you become even more excited and dedicated to the task when I am gone.

Thank you to everyone who has helped me over the years. I have learned a lot and grown in this position due to the dedication of the leaders in the children's department and from all the parents who decided that our church would play an important role in their kids' life. Likewise, I have learned a lot about faith and spiritual development from sharing with your children each week and watching them mature. I carry these experiences and influences with me to my new placement.

I will be attending one last field trip before I start my new ministry. On Saturday, May 15th, we will go to Frog Level Farm for an adventure with ropes, hay, and livestock (please dress for the occasion). The children will swing from bale to bale in the barn hayloft, be challenged by the ropes, obstacle course, and have an opportunity to interact with a breed of domesticated swine that is threatened to extinction.

If you would like to attend this trip, please see me or use the sign-up sheet outside the Global Adventures room. We will meet at the church at 9:00 a.m. and should return around 1:30 p.m. A picnic lunch will be provided for your child as part of the experience. The cost is \$5 per person. See you there!

From our Parish Nurse:

Let's face it: Being a good listener is not as easy as it sounds. We've all drifted off into our own thoughts when we're supposed to be paying attention to what someone else is saying. Maybe it's because the subject matter is boring or the person is speaking in a mono-tone; maybe you're distracted by some personal matter that worries you. Whatever it is, these tips can help improve our listening skills:

1. Listen more than you talk.
2. Stay focused on what the other person is saying-not on what you're going to say next. Don't plan a story you want to tell while the person is still talking.
3. Never finish another person's sentences.
4. Resist the urge to dominate the conversation. *(Review tip No. 1)*
5. Give appropriate feedback, but don't interrupt.
6. Occasionally mirror back short summations of what the other person is saying to keep your mind from moving on to other subjects and to assure the other person you've understood what they have been saying.
7. Look the other person in the eye as they talk, to show that you're interested.



When I was in nurse's training, one of my instructors used to tell us that if you give just 10 minutes of interested, uninterrupted listening, you'll find out all you need to know. Sometimes silence talks to us also. Silence lets the other person know that you are available and willing to listen when they are ready to share. Just being there, truly being present can build trust so that when the time comes to be a supportive listener, one that defers judgment and actively listens, it is accomplished. Asking a leading question then waiting for the response is another art in listening. Watching body language, both theirs and yours, is also important as non-verbal cues often speak loudest. Remember that thoughts move about four times as fast as speech so patience is required. Basically we need to treat the other person as you would want to be treated. God gave us two ears and only one mouth for a reason.

Proverbs 16: 23 "A wise man's heart guides his mouth....."
